

We ship worldwide FOB Savvy Art. Shipping charges are extra.

Shipping will be calculated after you contact us with the intention to purchase an artwork and provide your delivery address. Destinations in common mainland Canada and USA for smaller artworks tend to be lower cost. For all other destinations (including PEI, NFLD, Hawaii, and remote under services areas of the mainland) and for artworks larger than 800 square inches, shipping gets more expensive.

For very large artworks, conventional couriers cannot be used, so we shop around for the best price. We will quote the insurance (if applicable), shipping, packaging and delivery for those on a case by case basis. Please let us know if you wish to have your artwork installed. We can help you with installation.

We are very particular about packaging your purchase for safety and endurance. This could take up to 7 business days for larger artworks. For questions or unique shipping requests or if you wish to add insurance to your shipment, feel free to contact us directly. Go to the contact us page.

When you buy original art, the art will usually ship from the artist, unless we have it in the gallery. Prints, reproductions and limited editions are most likely shipped from Savvy Art in Oakville, but sometimes from the artist. Ask us where the artist is located if you wish to know.

We ship worldwide. We will inform you of the shipping charges for your approval before we complete the sale and ship.

Due to the unprecedented affects of economic volatility on shipping costs (not fun at all!!), we can only honour shipping quotes for 1 day. We may find a better way to ship the product to save on costs. Or we may be faced with a spike in costs.
